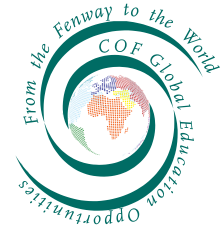

ASPRS: The Imaging and Geospatial Information Society

Deadline: December 1

ASPRS offers fourteen awards totaling more than \$50,000 in value. Available to both undergraduate and graduate student-members of ASPRS and others, to advance academic and professional goals within the fields of Photogrammetry, Remote Sensing and related disciplines. ASPRS recognizes that students are the future of these rapidly evolving fields and encourages all who are qualified to take advantage of these unique opportunities. Awards are \$2000 and are available in the form of cash, internship stipends, travel grants, and data. To be eligible, you must be enrolled in an accredited college or university, and you must be a member of ASPRS for many, but not all, awards. All awards ask that you submit samples of your work and research goals as part of your application and that you submit a report to ASPRS outlining your research accomplishments upon completion of your grant period. <http://www.asprs.org/>

Africa-America Institute/International Fellowships Program

The Ford Foundation International Fellowships Program provides opportunities for advanced study to exceptional individuals who will use this education to become leaders in their respective fields, furthering development in their own countries and greater economic and social justice worldwide. Fellows are drawn from diverse backgrounds, and IFP actively seeks candidates from social groups and communities that lack systematic access to higher education. This \$280 million ten year program is a global activity that provides support for up to three years of formal graduate-level study leading to a masters or doctoral degree. IFP fellows may choose to study in any academic discipline related to the Ford Foundation's three grant-making areas: asset building and community development; education, media, arts and culture; and peace and justice. <http://www.fordifp.org/Home/tabid/36/language/en-US/Default.aspx>

Alfa Fellowship Program

The Alfa Fellowship Program will award grants to qualified candidates (ages 25-35) to work for about five months at high level Russian business enterprises, media outlets, government and nongovernmental institutions, and civil society organizations. The Program includes all related travel expenses, a three-week Seminar Program in Moscow, and will provide Fellows with a stipend and housing during their work assignments. Asian Cultural Council

Deadline: November 15

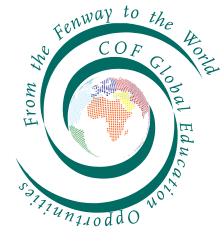
Fellowships available for Asian artists, scholars, and specialists to conduct research, study, receive specialized training, or pursue creative activity in the United States. Some grants are also made to Americans pursuing similar activities in Asia and to educational and cultural institutions engaged in projects of special significance to Asian-American exchange. <http://www.asianculturalcouncil.org>

Association of Teachers of Japanese/Bridging Scholarships for Study in Japan

Applications for Bridging Scholarships are accepted twice a year. Funding from private foundations and major U.S. corporations has made it possible for ATJ to award 100 scholarships annually to assist American students with the travel and living expenses they will incur while studying abroad in Japan. Undergraduate students majoring in any field of study are eligible to apply for these scholarships. Japanese language study is not a prerequisite. Applicants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents and be enrolled in a college or university in the United States. Bridging Scholarship recipients receive a stipend of \$2,500 (for students on semester-long programs) or \$4,000 (for students on academic year programs). <http://www.colorado.edu/ealld/atj/Bridging/scholarships.html>

Beinecke Scholarship

The Beinecke Scholarship is given to 20 students with superior standards of intellectual ability, scholastic achievement and personal promise his or her undergraduate career. Applicants must be juniors who plan on entering masters or doctoral programs in the arts, humanities or social sciences. Students must have a documented history of need-based financial aid/ along with the application, students must submit a resume, a personal statement, a copy of official transcript, and four letters of recommendation. Blakemore Foundation Grants for Advanced Study of Asian Languages

Approximately 14 grants available each year for the advanced study of modern Chinese, Japanese, Korean, and Southeast Asian languages. <http://www.blakemorefoundation.org>

Boren Scholarship (NSEP)

The National Security Education Program (NSEP) awards scholarships to US undergraduate students for study of world regions critical to U.S. interests (including Africa, Asia, Central & Eastern Europe, Eurasia, Latin America & the Caribbean, and the Middle East). The countries of Western Europe, Canada, Australia, and New Zealand are excluded. NSEP focuses on geographic areas, languages, and fields of study deemed critical to U.S. national security. It draws on a broad definition of national security applied by the President in his annual National Security Strategy, recognizing that the scope of national security has expanded to include not only the traditional concerns of protecting and promoting American well-being, but also the challenges of global society, including: sustainable development, environmental degradation, global disease and hunger, population growth and migration, and economic competitiveness. http://www.borenawards.org/boren_scholarship

Bosch Foundation Fellowship Program (Robert)

Deadline: Oct. 15

The fellowship program strives to strengthen the ties of understanding between the U.S. and Germany and to familiarize American professionals and executives with the political, economic, and cultural environment of Europe. The fellowships are for nine-months and are available to those who possess a graduate degree and/or two years of professional experience in one of the following fields: Business Administration, Economics, Journalism, Mass/Communications, Law, Political Science, or Public Affairs/Public Policy. <http://www.cdsintl.org/>

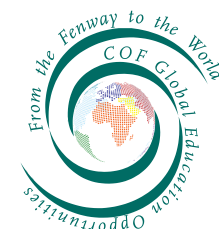

FastWeb

If you are willing to fill in the online forms, this service promises a free customized list of financial aid sources. FastWeb is actually a searchable database of more than 400,000 private sector scholarships, fellowships, grants, and loans from more than 3,000 sources for all levels of higher education. First-time visitors have to register (first and last name and a user ID), then complete a profile, including background and fields of study. Registrants then receive a list of all currently relevant funding sources. The registration information is stored and can be used on subsequent visits. The entire sign-up process, and delivery of available funding sources, can be a bit tedious: about five to twenty minutes, depending on the connection speed. Approximately 500 new scholarships are added to the database daily, so registrants can stay current. Freeman Awards for Study in Asia (Freeman-ASIA)

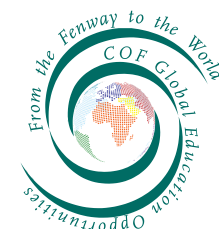
The primary goal of Freeman-ASIA, an IIE-administered awards program generously supported by the Freeman Foundation, is to increase the number of American undergraduates to study abroad in East and Southeast Asia, by providing students with the information and the financial assistance they will need. Awardees will be expected to share their experiences overseas with their home campuses to encourage study abroad by others, and to spread a better understanding of the cultures, the histories, and the economies of Asia within their home communities. <http://www.iie.org/programs/Freeman-ASIA/>

Goldwater Scholarship

The Barry M. Goldwater Scholarship and Excellence in Education Program was established by Congress in 1986 to honor Senator Barry M. Goldwater. The purpose of the Foundation is to provide a continuing source of highly qualified scientists, mathematicians, and engineers by awarding scholarships to college students (sophomores and juniors) who intend to pursue careers in these fields. <http://www.act.org/goldwater>

Gerald Ford Foundation/ Research Travel Grants

The Gerald R. Ford Foundation awards grants of up to \$2,000 each in support of research in the holdings of the Gerald R. Ford Library. A grant defrays travel, living, and photocopies expenses of a research trip to the Ford Library. Foreign applicants are responsible for the costs of travel between their home country and North America, since the grants only cover travel within North America. German Marshall Fund of the United States/Marshall Memorial Fellowship

The Marshall Memorial Fellowship (MMF) provides a unique opportunity for emerging leaders between age 25-40 from the United States and Europe to explore societies, institutions, and people on the other side of the Atlantic. The MMF program draws Fellows from 14 European countries and the United States for a three- to four-week traveling program. American and European Fellows each visit five or six cities per trip. They meet formally and informally with a range of policymakers and prominent members of the business, government, political, NGO, and media communities. GMF works closely with partner institutions and individual consultants in each city, providing Fellows with an invaluable local perspective on the transatlantic and domestic issues on the agenda. Along the way, each Fellow has the opportunity to explore his or her own professional interests beyond the group programs, which focus on a range of domestic and international policy areas. <http://www.gmfus.org/fellowships/mmf.cfm>

Gilman Scholarship from the US Dept of State

The Gilman Scholarship Program provides awards for U.S. undergraduate students who are receiving Federal Pell Grant funding at a two-year or four-year college or university to participate in study abroad programs worldwide. It is open to U.S. citizen undergraduate students who are planning to study abroad. The program aims to diversify the kinds of students who study abroad and the countries and regions where they go by supporting undergraduates who might otherwise not participate due to financial constraints. The Gilman Scholarship Program accepts applications two times per year. Ideally, students should begin their application one full semester before their study abroad program is scheduled to begin. 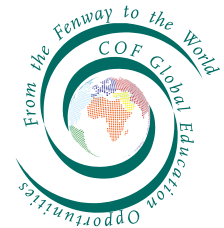
Gyles Education Awards

They are the result of a private, benevolent endeavor established in 1990 with the help of a Canadian/American Benefactor. Full Canadian or American citizenship is a requirement. Minimum GPA 2.7. Criteria other than strictly academic

International Research & Exchanges Board/Short Term Travel Grants

Deadline: February 1

The Short-Term Travel Grants program provides fellowships for up to eight weeks to US postdoctoral scholars and holders of other professional terminal graduate degrees for independent or collaborative research projects in Europe and Eurasia. Grants must not require administrative assistance or logistical support. Fellowships in Policy Research and Development are available to applicants who demonstrate how their research will make a substantive contribution to knowledge of the contemporary political, economic, historical, or cultural developments in the region and how such knowledge is relevant to US foreign policy.

The scholarship pays university fees, cost of living expenses, an annual book grant, thesis grant, research and daily travel grants, fares to and from the United States and, where

applicable, a contribution towards the support of a dependent spouse. Open only to United States citizens who (at the time they take up their scholarship) hold a first degree from an accredited four-year college or university in the United States with a minimum GPA of 3.7. Mitchell Scholarships (Ireland)

The US-Ireland Alliance sponsors a prestigious, competitive, national scholarship to enable American citizens between the ages of 18 and 30 to study at universities on the island of Ireland. The George J. Mitchell Scholarships, named in honor of the former Senator's pivotal contribution to the Northern Ireland peace process, are intended to familiarize and engage the next generation of America's leaders with the island of Ireland. These scholarships allow Americans to pursue one year of post-graduate study in any discipline offered at institutions of higher learning in Ireland and Northern Ireland. Morris K. Udall Scholarships

The Morris K. Udall Scholarship Foundation is now accepting applications. The foundation awards 80 scholarships of up to \$5,000 to outstanding scholars; 50 students receive \$350 honorable mention awards. Two main eligible groups can apply: 1) Current sophomores and juniors who have outstanding potential and who study the environment and related fields; many majors may apply. 2) Native American and Alaska Native students who are college sophomores or juniors in the current academic year, who have outstanding potential, and study fields related to health care or tribal public policy. www.udall.gov

Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowship for New Americans

Deadline: November 1

The Paul and Daisy Soros Fellowships for New Americans support thirty individuals a year for up to two years of graduate study in any subject anywhere in the United States. Students already in graduate school are eligible as long as they have not completed their second year. The fellowship provides \$20,000 maintenance and half tuition wherever the fellow attends. Candidates must be either holders of green cards, naturalized citizens, or children of two naturalized citizen parents. <http://www.pdsoros.org/>

Rhodes Scholarship

Deadline: Oct 4, midnight U.S Hawaii time.

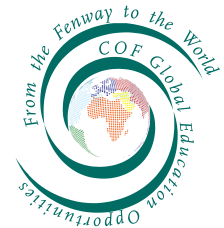
This prestigious international scholarship is designed to bring outstanding students to the University of Oxford. Nominees must display extraordinary intellectual distinction. Applicants must provide a sufficient basis for their proposed field of study. Each year, 32 American scholars are selected. SSRC fellowship and grant programs are widely known in social science communities in the U.S. and abroad. These prestigious and highly competitive awards cover graduate training, dissertation work, postdoctoral training and research, professional foreign travel. While eligibility requirements vary, many awards are open to non U.S. citizens. Truman Scholarship

The Truman Scholarship is awarded to juniors interested in government and/or other aspects of public service. Truman nominees should have an extensive record of public service and community service and have an outstanding leadership potential and communication skills. 70- 75 scholarships for up to \$30,000 are awarded annually to each scholarship recipient. Like the Udall and many other scholarships, students must be nominated by their respective colleges. <http://www.truman.gov>

Udall Scholarship

The Udall Foundation seeks future leaders across a wide spectrum of environmental fields, including policy, engineering, science, education, urban planning and renewal, business, health, justice, and economics. The Foundation awards 80 scholarships of up to \$5000 and 50 honorable mentions of \$350 to sophomore and junior level college students committed to careers related to the environment, tribal public policy, or Native American health care. Scholarships are offered in any of three categories: (1) students who have demonstrated commitment to careers related to the environment; or (2) To Native American and Alaska Native students who have demonstrated commitment to careers related to tribal public policy; or (3) Native American and Alaska Native students who have demonstrated commitment to careers related to Native health care.

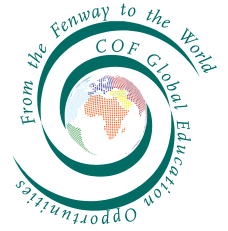
